

All the baptized have a calling in God's world. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called "the house of God, and ... the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

WEEKLY NEWS

THANK YOU TO TODAY'S CANTORS, Mary Rowe and Brenda Searle. We also welcome our guest singer, Nancy Richards. Nancy's voice joins our own Philip and Beverly Kriner's voices in today's anthem. Nancy is Beverly's longtime friend and college roommate. Thanks to technology, we can enjoy their singing even while they are in Florida.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES will be held in the regular classroom. SUNDAY SCHOOL for preschool through fifth grade will resume at a later time.

BISHOP CHRISTOPHER DEFOREST has begun leading our Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod. After serving congregations in New Mahoning and Kutztown, as well as prior business experience in convention planning and technology, he has begun his ministry with us. There have been some synod staff changes (which is normal, and some are due to retirements), but Pastor Kathleen Ash-Flashner is continuing as the Associate to the Bishop for our Schuylkill Mission District.

DIAPERS, SANITARY NAPKINS, AND INCONTINENCE BED PADS will be collected from now through January 31 for our Council of Churches' Food Pantry. Serving over 200 households each month with supplemental food, our volunteers at Jerusalem have also been making free diapers and personal care products available for distribution by driving down and hauling them back from the Lehigh Valley. The Philadelphia Diaper Bank which has supplied these items had used volunteers to drive them from Philly up to the Lehigh Valley. However with the pandemic, they are having more difficulty getting corporate donations, as well as volunteers to drive them to the Lehigh Valley. Since diapers and other care products are expensive, and cannot be purchased with Pennsylvania SNAP (formerly the food stamp program), this diaper drive is a great way to support our struggling neighbors. After worship, you will be able to drop your donations in the big red shopping cart – either by dropping out your car window or *carefully getting out of your car while cars are leaving worship*.

TANYA CARTWRIGHT, OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH AND FAMILY MINISTRY has a new, full-time job. However, both she and the church value her work with children, youth, and adults (made much more difficult during the

pandemic), so we are pleased that she will be able to continue but at an average

of 10 hours a week, rather than 20. Coming up soon – Bear Creek Camp, and information about registering for the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2022.

AFTER THE STORMING OF OUR CAPITAL BUILDING LAST WEEK, Presiding Bishop Eaton, together with leaders of the National Council of Churches (a council of major denominations ranging from some Baptists to Roman Catholic observers, but with few modern Evangelicals) strongly spoke against the violence, polarization, and presidential rhetoric – not as a matter of party, but as a matter for Christians who follow the way of Jesus to seek justice and peace. GOD'S BARNYARD. On December 21, 2020, we received an email from the ELCA Good Gifts Program that all donations submitted on that day for God's Barnyard would be doubled. So, we gathered all of the donations we had received to date and submitted them to be matched. With both mail in donations and online donations ---when doubled--we made a total impact of \$8,160. We received an additional \$145.00 after Dec. 21. Therefore, with all donations and matching funds, our grand total for our 2020 God's Barnyard was \$8,305.00! JANUARY 15th WAS THE BIRTHDAY OF MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

Martin Luther King Jr. was an American Baptist minister and activist who was a leader in the Civil Rights Movement. He was born January 15, 1929, and is best known for his role in the advancement of civil rights using nonviolent civil disobedience based on his Christian beliefs. The church commemorates him as a renewer of society and martyr. One of his famous quotes is: "*Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that.*"
