





LORD'S PRAYER



WANDERING IN THE WILDERNESS

Inspired by the ELCA's
Lenten study, "A way in the wilderness," the Social
Ministry Committee would like to encourage you to participate in your own
Lenten discipline by giving weekly suggestions for you to enhance how you make your way through Lent.

Week 2 "Wandering in the Wilderness" "I must be on my way" (Luke 13:33)

In Luke 13, Jesus is teaching people through parables and ministering to them. The Pharisees warned Jesus that Herod wanted to kill him. But Jesus would not be deterred from the work he wanted to do.

During Lent, we turn inward, reflecting on our dependence on God's grace. Repentance and self-reflection are important practices, but the season is about so much more than our own self-examination. The season of Lent also leads us to turn outward. Herod is coming for him, and Jesus responds, "I have work to do."

As people of faith, we look to Jesus' example to reach out and help others. This week, you are encouraged to mindfully seek ways to display <u>random acts of kindness</u>. Give a compliment to a stranger, babysit for free, let someone go in front of you in line at the store, or send someone a "Thinking of you" card. A little kindness goes a long way!
