

As we continue through the time after Epiphany, stories of the call to discipleship show us the implications of our baptismal calling to show Christ to the world. Jesus begins proclaiming the good news and calling people to repentance right after John the Baptist is arrested for preaching in a similar way. Knowing that John was later executed, we see at the very outset the cost of discipleship. Still, the two sets of brothers leave everything they have known and worked for all their lives to follow Jesus and fish for people.

- TO TALK TO EACH OTHER BEFORE OR AFTER THE SERVICE roll down your windows and wear a mask. Due to traffic *please don't get out of your car to mill around* (in addition to members parking their cars, remember that the south side of the parking lot has a public road cutting through it!).
- BATHROOMS are available through the front and back doors of the building.

WEEKLY NEWS

THANK YOU TO TODAY'S CANTORS, Jonathan Valori & William Timm, and Jim & Linda Covert. Our anthem for today was recorded by Jonathan and Bill.

CONFIRMATION CLASSES will be held in the regular classroom. SUNDAY SCHOOL for preschool through fifth grade will resume at a later time.

BISHOP CHRISTOPHER DEFOREST has begun leading our Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod. After serving congregations in New Mahoning and Kutztown, as well as prior business experience in convention planning and technology, he has begun his ministry with us. There have been some synod staff changes (which is normal, and some are due to retirements), but Pastor Kathleen Ash-Flashner is continuing as the Associate to the Bishop for our Schuylkill Mission District.

DIAPERS, SANITARY NAPKINS, AND INCONTINENCE BED PADS will be collected from now through January 31 for our Council of Churches' Food Pantry. Serving over 200 households each month with supplemental food, our volunteers at Jerusalem have also been making free diapers and personal care products available for distribution by driving down and hauling them back from the Lehigh Valley. The Philadelphia Diaper Bank which has supplied these items had used volunteers to drive them from Philly up to the Lehigh Valley. However with the pandemic, they are having more difficulty getting corporate donations, as well as volunteers to drive them to the Lehigh Valley. Since diapers and other care products are expensive, and cannot be purchased with Pennsylvania SNAP (formerly the food stamp program), this diaper drive is a great way to support our struggling neighbors. After worship, you will be able to drop your donations in the big red shopping cart – either by dropping out your car window or *carefully getting out of your car while cars are leaving worship*.

THE ANNUAL SOUPER BOWL OFFERING will be held in conjunction with the Super Bowl throughout the country on Sunday, February 7. On a day when millions of dollars will be spent on gambling, commercials, and food and drink, in a country when ONE in FIVE children do not have adequate food security, we gather an offering of money for our Council of Churches' Food Pantry. So let us consider how much we spend for fun on the Super Bowl, and give at least that much so that all may at least have Soup.

TANYA CARTWRIGHT, OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH AND FAMILY MINISTRY has a new, full-time job. However, both she and the church value her work with children, youth, and adults (made much more difficult during the pandemic), so we are pleased that she will be able to continue but at an average of 10 hours a week, rather than 20. Coming up soon – Bear Creek Camp, and information about registering for the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2022.

Of course the time of your vaccine will be subject to availability and the priority that will be assigned to you based on the questionnaire that you will have filled out when you registered. PLEASE PRAY FOR OUR JERUSALEM CHILDCARE CENTER. Our daycare is open again with all programs currently operating. Illnesses spread "like wildfire" through daycares and schools normally. This year's cold/flu season is much scarier, and our daycare has handled the pandemic very well.
