Lent begins on February 14th this year on Ash Wednesday. We will be singing one of three hymns that are celebrating their 500th anniversary of being included in the first Lutheran hymnal, the Achtliederbuch. The title of this first hymn is "Out of the Depths I Cry to You", text and music by Martin Luther, and appropriate for Ash Wednesday. Later this year we will be singing the other two hymns.

On the following Wednesdays in Lent we will again be singing Holden's Evening Prayer Service, written by Marty Haugen. He wrote this service during the winter of 1986 while at Holden Village retreat in the North Cascade Mountains of Washington State. This will be accompanied by our handbell choir, acoustic guitar, choir leaders, and special instrumentalists. The Chancel Choir will also be sharing an anthem each week. The Handbell Choir will be rehearsing on Sunday mornings after worship during Lent while the Chancel Choir will rehearse after Evening Prayer services. Make sure to be in attendance to enjoy these special Lenten worship services.

On Palm Sunday, March 24th, Jerusalem Bells will play special music, and on Easter Jerusalem Brass Quartet will raise up joyous sounds!

The final concert in our concert series for this season is a very special guest - Pastor Laine's daughter Karin. She is an accomplished vocalist and will be joined by two friends playing piano and flute. The date for this concert is April 14 at 3:00pm. Rebates from Boyer's Food Market -

Jerusalem will earn a rebate of 1% of your grocery shopping bill if you participate in Boyer's Rebate Program. How? Pick up a Boyer's key tag in the church lobby and scan it every time you shop at Boyer's. It's automatically tallied, and we get a check twice a year.

Redner's Save-A-Tape Rewards -

When you shop at Redner's, scan your Redner's Rewards card/key tag, save your receipt, and bring them to church. The whole receipt must be submitted (the words, "Save A Tape Total" must be visible) or it will not be accepted. Jerusalem will receive 1% of your purchases! Place your rewards tapes in the Redner's box in the church lobby.



While you are thinking about grocery shopping, remember to pick up something for the Little Free Pantry!

The Little Free Pantry has turned out to be a blessing to those in need in our community. Every day several people help themselves to a snack, a bottle of water, or a pop-top canned food item. It's not a lot, but it's something. A few food items are added nearly every day and those with food insecurities stop by for a little something to eat.

Your donations help keep this ministry going. Pop-top cans of soup or Chef Boy R Dee pasta meals, cracker packets, snack foods and bottled water are always a good donation. Place your donations in the tote with the green lid in the church lobby or, if the Little Free Pantry is empty, place it right in the LFP. Monetary donations work, too. Make your check to Jerusalem Lutheran Church, noting Little Free Pantry on the memo line.

News from your "old" treasurer...

Did you know, before we installed our new HVAC system in 2019, we were spending over \$58,000 a year on electric to heat and cool the church? This past year our total cost for electric and propane was \$40,880.49. That is quite a savings! The decision to renovate was a wise one. Your Capital Campaign donations for the renovations of the roof and HVAC systems amounted to almost \$44,000 last year! Those funds came from your offerings and from the Legacy Endowment Fund. We are just about 2 ½ years away from our goal of paying off the loan early before the interest rates go up at the end of 7 years of a 15 year term. Let's make a great commitment to finish the loan by considering an increase this year in your offerings for the Capital Campaign. Every little bit of extra offerings helps us get closer to the end! Thank you for your generous offerings over the past few years. Together we can get this done!

I have been blessed with being able to serve this congregation as its treasurer since April 2015. It has been a pleasure working with so many great people in our church! What is special about our congregation is that we get along so well and we work as a team. I believe we have a common goal.....to see our church be a success so we can continue our mission of helping others.

The Legacy committee meets 4 times a year. We meet on the first Tuesday of February, May, August, and November. Current members of the Legacy Committee are: Bill Shay, Julie Coleman, Jill McCloy, Phil Kriner, Joanne Wertz, Linda Collins, Deb Reed, and Karen Dudley.

The goal of this fund is to enhance Jerusalem's mission beyond the ministries that would normally be funded by regular congregational giving. Therefore, we seek to use this endowment for mission and ministry to the name of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Each meeting we vote to donate our proceeds of 10% to the wider church, 45% for future use for capital improvements or major renovations, and 45% for ministries beyond those normally funded by the financial stewardship of the congregation.

The Legacy Committee received a quarterly dividend of \$2173.60.

The category A, 10%, \$217.36 was voted on to be used towards the wider church.

The Category B, 45%, \$978.12, was voted on to be used toward the Capital Campaign which involved the roof and HVAC repairs.

The Category C, 45%, \$978.12, was combined with an accrued balance totaling 5979.72. We voted to designate \$2000 to go towards the Copy Cat copier contract in our church office and \$1000 to go towards replenishing food in our Council of Churches food pantry. This leaves a current balance of \$2979.12 in that account.

All of our recommendations were approved by church council at its December meeting.
